

Common Toxins/Toxic plants and Cats.

Following is a list of some of the plants and household substances which are toxic to cats. This is not an exhaustive list. An expanded list can be viewed on web sites such as www.cat-world.com.au.

Please remember that cats do not necessarily have to eat the toxic substances. Toxins sprayed on grass or other surfaces on which the cat sleeps or rolls, or on surfaces the cat may rub against, may be transferred to the fur and ingested later during normal grooming.
